# SEYMOUR NARROWS

Seymour Narrows is a 5-kilometre (3.1 mi) section of the Discovery Passage in British Columbia known for strong tidal currents. Discovery Passage lies between Vancouver Island at Menzies Bay, British Columbia and Quadra Island except at its northern end where the eastern shoreline is Sonora Island. The section known as Seymour Narrows begins about 18 km (11 mi) from the south end of Discovery Passage where it enters the Georgia Strait near Campbell River. For most of the length of the narrows, the channel is about 750 metres (820 yd) wide. Through this narrow channel, currents can reach 15 knots (28 km/h; 17 mph).

The narrows were named for Rear Admiral Sir George Francis Seymour who commanded the Pacific Station from 1844 to 1848. Seymour Narrows was described by Captain George Vancouver as "one of the vilest stretches of water in the world." Even after Ripple Rock was removed, it remains a challenging route. In March 1981, the freighter Star Philippine ran aground in the narrows.

Seymour Narrows is notable also because the flowing current can be sufficiently turbulent to realize a Reynolds number of about 10^{9}, i.e. one billion, which is possibly the largest Reynolds number regularly attained in natural water channels on Earth (the current speed is about 8 m/s, 26 ft/s, the nominal depth about 100 m, 330 ft). Turbulence develops usually around a Reynolds number of 2000, depending on the geometric structure of the channel. Seymour Narrows delineates part of the northern extent of the Salish Sea.

Ripple Rock was a submerged twin-peak mountain that lay just nine feet beneath the surface of Seymour Narrows. It was a serious hazard to shipping, sinking 119 vessels and taking 114 lives. The gunboat USS Saranac was one of the rock's first recorded victims. On April 5, 1958, after twenty-seven months of tunneling and engineering work, Ripple Rock was blown up with 1,375 tons of Nitramex 2H explosive making it the largest commercial, non-nuclear blast in North America. The Halifax Explosion in 1917 was larger but it was not a deliberate act.

The event was broadcast live on Canadian television. The footage is also regularly screened at the Campbell River Museum.

Vancouver band The Evaporators wrote a song about the event and released it on their 2004 album Ripple Rock.





Ketchikan is known as Alaska's "first city" due to its location at the southern tip of the Inside Passage—it is the first city you reach as you cruise north, and for many visitors, their first introduction to the beauty and majesty of Alaska.

The Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian people have lived in southeastern Alaska for over 10,000 years, and their arts, culture, and history can be seen throughout Ketchikan. The town of Ketchikan was founded as a salmon cannery site in 1885, and for years the city was known as the "Canned Salmon Capital of the World." Logging became an important industry as well, and when cruise ships started exploring the waters of the Inside Passage, Ketchikan naturally became a popular port of call.

Just 90 miles north of Prince Rupert, British Columbia, Ketchikan hugs the bluffs that form the shoreline along the southwest corner of Revillagigedo Island. Stretching 31 miles long but never more than 10 blocks wide, Ketchikan is centered on Tongass Avenue. On one side of the avenue, many businesses and homes are built on stilts out over the water, while on the other side they cling to the steep slopes and often have winding wooden staircases leading to their doors.

Ketchikan boasts the largest number of totem poles in Alaska, a collection that includes recently carved poles and some that are more than 100 years old. The Totem Heritage Center, which offers classes in Native arts, houses a large collection of Native artifacts, including several ancient totem poles, cedar bark baskets, beaded regalia, button robes, and other beautifully hand-crafted works of art.

The downtown area contains two large harbors, several cruise ship docks, and many of Ketchikan's main attractions, including historic Creek Street, a picturesque boardwalk path built over Ketchikan Creek on stilts. Creek Street was Ketchikan's famed red-light district until 1954. Today, the street is home to art galleries, gift shops, bookstores, restaurants, and is a photographer's delight.

The most popular house in the 1930s on Creek Street was Dolly's House, the parlor of the city's most famous madam, Dolly Arthur. Today, it's a museum dedicated to this notorious era. Inside you're guided through the brothel, hear about Dolly's intriguing life in Alaska, and see, among other things, its bar, which was placed over a trapdoor to the creek for quick disposal of bootleg whiskey.

The city center is best viewed from Ketchikan's Waterfront Promenade that skirts the busy shoreline and is equipped with historical markers and whale-tail benches for visitors to rest and take in the maritime scenery.







# JUNEAU | THE STATE CAPITAL

Juneau is many things: a mountain town, a coastal community and the most scenic capital city in the U.S. A natural wonder, wildlife hotspot and cultural jewel, Juneau is rich in history, art, music and Native heritage. It's an outdoor enthusiast's paradise, a shopper's trove and a food lover's dream - not just the state capital, but the beating heart of Southeast Alaska.

Juneau sits snugly between Mount Juneau, Mount Roberts, and Gastineau Channel, and is a maze of narrow streets running past a mix of new structures, old storefronts, and quaint houses featuring early 19th-century architecture from the town's gold-mining days. With no road access to Juneau, it is the only state capital in the United States that can only be reached by airplane or boat.

One of the reasons Juneau has so much character is that it's one of Alaska's oldest cities. Established before the big Klondike Gold Rush of 1898, Juneau also has gold in its past. In 1880, a local Tlingit Indian chief led prospectors Joe Juneau and Richard Harris to what later became known as Gold Creek, where the two men discovered nuggets just lying on the ground. Soon after, a town site was established, making Juneau the first city founded after the purchase of Alaska by the United States from Russia. The area later became home to what was at the time the largest hard-rock gold mine in the world—the Treadwell Mine. Juneau became Alaska's territorial capital in 1906, and, after statehood in 1959, its state capital.


Juneau's lively downtown is compact, easy to navigate on foot, and always a favorite with visitors. Within easy walking distance of the cruise ship docks are many of Juneau's main attractions, including the State Capitol Building, Saint Nicholas Russian Orthodox Church, several museums, and historic South Franklin Street. Also nearby is the Juneau Convention & Visitors Bureau with visitor information, displays, and walking-tour maps of the city.

Just a block from the waterfront is Historic South Franklin Street, a refurbished historical district where many buildings date from the early 1900s and have since been turned into bars, gift shops, and restaurants. Nearby is delightful Marine Park, with spotting scopes for visitors to search Mount Juneau for mountain goats. Also not to be missed is Tahku, an impressive life-size bronze humpback-whale statue that appears to be leaping from an infinity pool near the Juneau-Douglass Bridge.

Just a short drive from downtown, one of the city's most iconic sites awaits: Mendenhall Glacier. The glacier sits within the Tongass National Forest — the largest national forest in the United States. The river of ice flows 12 miles from its source, the Juneau Icefield, and has a 1.5-mile-wide face.

Whale watching is a popular way to see the diverse marine life in the area including Steller sea lions, Dall's porpoise, orcas, and humpback whales.



Highlights: Nestled along America's longest fjord — the gorgeous Lynn Canal — Haines was first settled by Tlingit Indians. Totem poles are sprinkled about town, and fascinating artifacts from the Tlingits and the early pioneers are displayed in the Sheldon Museum. But nature is Haines' chief draw. Brown bears, moose and bald eagles are plentiful.

**Shopping:** Haines is exceptionally artsy, so buy jewelry, wooden carvings and nature photos.

**Dining:** Salmon and halibut are king, prepared however you like it.

# HAINES - THE ADVENTURE CAPITAL OF ALASKA

Haines is uniquely situated at the convergence of the largest World Heritage Site in North America with a perfect sample of Alaska's history, scenic beauty, arts, culture, wildlife, and lifestyle.

The strong cultural ties of the area are also of great interest. You can see native carvers and artists at Alaska Indian Arts or head out to the village of Klukwan and visit their cultural museum. For a different experience, visit The Hammer Museum, the only one of its kind in North America. The American Bald Eagle Foundation gives you a great opportunity to learn more about these amazing raptors and a chance to meet some of their residents. Haines was named in honor of Francina Haines of the Presbyterian Home Missions Board. Accompanied by his friend, John Muir, S. Hall Young was the first missionary to the area in 1879. The purpose of their trip was to scout a location for a mission and a school.

In 1902, ongoing border disputes between the U.S. and Canada provided the justification for an army post in Alaska. The white buildings of Fort William H. Seward still stand and are a distinctive landmark of Haines. Decommissioned in 1947, the fort was bought by a group of war veterans with hopes of creating an arts and commerce community. The buildings are now privately owned homes, accommodations, restaurants, galleries, and shops.

The first people to call the Chilkat Valley home were Tlingit Indians. Originally called "Dei-Shu" or "End of the Trail", Haines is home of the Chilkat Indians whose mother village is Klukwan, located 22 miles north of Haines. Klukwan is recognized as the earliest of the Chilkat villages and contains many reminders of its rich past. Now the Haines Highway into Canada, and previously the Dalton trail used by gold-seekers, the Tlingit trade route to the interior was dubbed the "grease trail' because the most important item carried was oil extracted from the eulachon fish.

The truly majestic scenery of Haines comes from the glacier terrain that formed the area many years ago. Haines is surrounded by mountains and water. Rising high above the town are the Takinsha Mountains and Chilkat Range to the south, Takshanuk Mountains to the north and Coast Mountains to the east across the Lynn Canal.

Haines is known for its abundance of wildlife and can be seen practically anywhere in the valley, even in the downtown area. Haines is known as "The Valley of the Eagles". Year-round resident eagles total approximately 400 but the population swells to over 3,500 in the autumn months of October through December when a late run of chum salmon in the Chilkat River provides a feast for these majestic raptors.



# HUBBARD GLACIER

An Alaska cruise toward Hubbard Glacier feels like you're approaching another planet in a tiny space craft. It is that big and that otherworldly. Among all the vanishing Alaska glaciers, Hubbard has a rapidly advancing ice margin — up to seven feet in one day — earning it the nickname, 'The Galloping Glacier'.

Hubbard Glacier cruises are so popular because of the glacier's three-story icebergs that cannon into crystal waters, a process called calving. It's also colorful. On clear days, Hubbard turns a stunning deep blue and on cloudy ones, its many ripples and icebergs shimmer in soft light.

This glacier dwarfs the other glaciers in Alaska. Hubbard Glacier is the largest

tidewater glacier in North America. It was named for Gardiner Hubbard, the founder of the National Geographic Society and National Geographic Magazine. It starts 122 kilometers (76 miles) back, pouring down off the shoulder of Mt. Walsh. It has an impressive terminal face that is 11 kilometers (7 miles) long and 106 meters (350 feet) above the water line, making its regular audience of Alaska cruise ships look like toy boats.

Nicknamed the 'Galloping Glacier', Hubbard moves faster than almost any other glacier on the continent. It advanced so fast in 1986 that it dammed Russell Fjord, and now it threatens a repeat performance. As your ship sails along its looming mass, listen for the loud, deep rumble. Wait for the mighty crack and the thunderous crash, then marvel as icebergs the size of large buildings crash into the sea.

As you sail into picturesque Yakutat Bay, the first all-weather, all-vessel safe harbor north of Icy Point, you'll be able to see Hubbard Glacier off in the distance. Passing miles of sandy beaches, keep your eyes peeled for harbor seals lounging on buoys or swimming in waters alongside the ship.

The Yakutat Bay Important Bird Area is known for its large population of breeding Kittlitz's murrelet. Its open-water habitat is also home to one of the largest breeding colonies of Aleutian terns. More than 200 species of birds can be seen in this area.



### **QUICK FACTS**

Highlights: Hoonah means, 'where the north wind doesn't blow', in the language of the Tlingit Indians, who make up about 70% of the population of this village on the lee side of Chichagof Island. However, wildlife outnumbers everyone, so watch for bears, eagles and humpback whales, which migrate here in the summer.

**Shopping:** Buy baskets, dolls and drawings, all handmade by the Tlingits.

**Dining:** 5 species of wild Alaskan salmon thrive here, so enjoy it baked or grilled.

# ICY STRAIT POINT (HOONAH)

The Huna Tlingit are the original inhabitants of Glacier Bay, where they lived for thousands of years. During the peak of the Little Ice Age, glacial advance forced the people to relocate from their homeland to present-day Hoonah. Translated, it means 'where the North wind doesn't blow'. Fur traders arrived on Hoonah's shores in the 1880's. Schools, churches and stores soon followed.

In 1912, the Hoonah Packing Company built the first cannery in the area, which today is Icy Strait Point. Ownership traded hands several times before the Icy Strait Salmon Company purchased the property in 1932. Since its inception, the cannery has played a key role in the community. Hoonah residents were employed there and when a fire destroyed the town on June 14, 1944, many residents made the cannery their home while the city was rebuilt.

While the cannery ceased to produce

salmon in 1953, the cannery was used by the renowned Hoonah fishing fleet as a maintenance and storage facility until the late 1990's. In the mid 1990's the Huna Totem Corporation bought the cannery and created what you see today. Currently, 85% of the staff at ISP are local Tlingit from Hoonah.

Icy Strait Point was originally built as a Salmon Cannery and has been an important part of the community for many years serving many functions. Icy Strait Point is Alaska Native owned-and-operated, with all profits directly supporting the community of Hoonah, Alaska's largest Native Tlingit village. Their dedicated staff is committed to providing one-of-a-kind experiences for every guest that is infused with the local Native culture and hospitality.

Chichagoff Island is home to more brown bears than humans, it's a place where eagles soar overhead and whales are regularly seen just offshore. Surrounded by towering rainforest and set against the backdrop of mist-shrouded mountains, guests can truly immerse themselves in the wilderness environment.

There are over 30 exciting tours, a restored 1912 salmon cannery, museum, nature trails and even a beach! Icy Strait Point is the port for adventure; Fly down the world's largest ZipRider, whale-watch in the nutrient-rich waters of Port Frederick and Point Adolphus, search for the coastal brown bears or soar high above in a helicopter.

Icy Strait Point has some of the most pristine waters anywhere in the world and it's teeming with wildlife for you to experience. Humpback sightings are a daily occurrence, but you can expect to see much more. Keep your eyes peeled for world-class wildlife like orca, bald eagles, sea otters, harbor seals, stellar sea lions and more.

There is so much to wildlife to see!





Highlights: Called 'Shee Atika' by the Tlingit Indians, then 'New Archangel' by the Russians who ousted them, Sitka boasts a multicultural heritage. Two dozen of its attractions are on the National Register of Historic Places, including Castle Hill and Building 29, a structure built by the Russians in 1835. The Sheldon Jackson Museum exhibits one of Alaska's oldest native culture collections.

**Shopping:** Take home Tlingit masks, silver jewelry and Russian lacquer boxes.

Dining: Savor succulent seafood or heartier comfort food.

# WILD SITKA

Sitka truly offers the best of Alaska. Its small-town appeal stems from a unique blend of Russian, Tlingit and American history. Its snow-capped peaks and volcanic Mount Edgecumbe pose among the state's most postcard-worthy scenes. Its rare wildlife astounds, from Saint Lazaria Island's orange-beaked puffins to Alaska Maritime Refuge's 40 million seabirds. Sitka is an island community boldly living between the mountains and sea, where the arts flourish and an ancient native culture still thrives. Surrounded by rainforest, they share their home with brown bears, bald eagles and all five species of Pacific salmon. In Sitka, they are deeply connected to the natural world around them. It informs their culture and inspires their art.

Sitka is the only Inside Passage community that fronts the Pacific Ocean. Located

on Sitka Sound, the city of about 8,500 residents is known for its Tlingit culture and picturesque remnants of its Russian heritage, including the onion-shaped domes and goldcolored crosses of the beloved Saint Michael's Russian Orthodox Cathedral. The city and borough limits include most of Baranof Island, where the city of Sitka is located, along with South Chichagof Island and many other small, forested islands along the coast. Sitka was originally inhabited by the Tlingit people who called the area 'Sheet'Ká', which means 'people on the outside of Shee', with Shee' being the Tlingit name for Baranof Island. When Russians arrived and claimed the area, they named the it New Archangel and it became the capital of Russian Alaska in 1808. Russia sold Alaska to the United States on October 18, 1867, with a transfer ceremony held in Sitka on Baranof Castle

State Historic Site.

Downtown Sitka features numerous art galleries, a fine bookstore, gift shops, several lodging options and restaurants with great views and local seafood, all nestled between the mountains and the ocean.

Perched over downtown is Baranof Castle State Historic Site, originally a stronghold of the Kiks.ádi Tlingit Clan. A succession of Russian buildings occupied the hill from 1804 – 1867, and on October 18, 1867, the Russians officially handed over Alaska to the United States on this site. Each year, Alaska Day is still celebrated on October 18. This historical site is managed by Alaska State Parks and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Marine wildlife is also abundant here, with humpback whales, sea otters and puffins. The best way to see them is from the water.





European contact with these peoples in the area was established through Spanish - and later British - exploration in the 1790's. In 1843, the Hudson's Bay Company erected Fort Victoria as a fur trading posting and formed commercial relationships with these local First Nations. Demolished in 1864 as the surrounding population grew, the fort occupied the present-day site of downtown Victoria. The fort, city and region are named for Queen Victoria, who was the reigning British monarch when the fort was built. The Greater Victoria visitor economy has a long and storied history. Its origins can be traced to 1861 when the British Columbia House of Assembly provided £500 "for

diffusing information about Vancouver Island". Organized destination marketing in Greater Victoria has existed in various forms since 1901, when the first meeting to create a local tourism association was held. For decades regional, provincial, national and international visitors have flocked to Greater Victoria. However, over the years the appeal of Greater Victoria has changed as the destination has evolved. Many attractions and accommodations remain from previous years, such as The Butchart Gardens, Chinatown, British Columbia Parliament Buildings and The Fairmont Empress to name a few. Visitors came to experience Greater Victoria's English image and relaxing atmosphere. As a coastal city, Greater Victoria's location on the Pacific Ocean was always a fundamental marketing element. However, Greater

Victoria's tourism product offering has grown and become more diverse. Victoria has more restaurants per person than any other city in Canada. Local First Nations are creating new visitor experiences and telling their stories. The visitor economy is the second largest industry in Greater Victoria, employing thousands of people and generating billions in economic impact. From its early, uneven days in the 19th Century to its position as a stalwart of the community today, the Greater Victoria visitor economy has - and will continue to be - part of Greater Victoria's identity.

Victoria's West Coast cuisine showcases local ingredients from the Saanich Peninsula and Cowichan Valley and, with over a dozen craft breweries, cider houses, artisanal distilleries and wineries, you certainly won't go thirsty.





For guests who wish to settle part of their account in cash, please note that accounts must be settled at Reception by 6 am on June 27. ALL ACCOUNTS will be closed at 6:30 am and no further changes will be made.

### CUSTOMS INFORMATION

Please be aware that luggage searches may be conducted by hand during disembarkation. This is a requirement by Customs and Quarantine Authorities. If you have questions please contact Reception. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

You must declare currency over \$10,000 U.S. If you have questions please contact Reception.

Returning U.S. residents are allowed to import free of duty at a total of \$800 of merchandise per person. Visitors (non-residents) are normally entitled to an exemption of \$100.

Tobacco Products: For persons 18 years of age and older, a total of 200 cigarettes or 100 cigars. Excess U.S. cigarettes 'Made for export only' and 'Tax exempt outside the U.S.' will be seized. Foreign manufactured tobacco products will be subject to duty and internal revenue tax. Up to 50 Cuban cigars may be imported into the U.S.

Alcohol: For persons 21 years of age and older, a total of 1(one) liter of alcohol may be imported duty free. Applicable internal revenue taxes and duties will be assessed on alcoholic beverages.

Duty Free Items: Artwork, U.S. made products, antiques (must have a certificate stating over 100 years old), un-set loose gemstones (rubies, emeralds, diamonds and sapphires), cosmetics, perfume and local handcrafts.

Prohibited Items: Fruit, nuts, plants, soil, flowers, drugs, narcotics, indecent materials, African ivory, snake skin, turtle shell products, guns or weapons.

Undeclared merchandise is subject to seizure and/or penalty. Please have all your receipts available upon inspection.
